LRS RENEWAL - OPEN ENROLLMENT BEGINS FOR THE 2024-2025 LAWYER REFERRAL SERVICE PANEL

Enrollment is now open for the Association's Lawyer Referral Service (LRS) for the 2024-2025 Bar year. Panel membership is open to any lawyer who meets the necessary qualifications. The new LRS panel begins on June 1 and continues through May 31, 2025. Members serving on the current panel must re-enroll for the new LRS year.

Each year the LRS makes some 2,000 referrals to callers with legal problems who are able to afford a private attorney; many of them fee-generating cases. You can be part of this important program that helps expand your client base through prescreened referrals while providing a terrific community service for individuals requiring legal services.

The annual registration fee is \$100 for those admitted to the New Jersey Bar up to five years, or \$200 for those admitted for six years or more. Please note that all LRS panel members are required to remit back to the Bar Association 10% of fees collected over \$500 for all matters referred by the LRS. The fee applies to any referral received from the LRS and is payable when the participating attorney receives payment for services rendered.

A completed application, together with the appropriate enrollment fee and required original certificate of malpractice insurance coverage, must be returned to the Bar Association before referrals can be made in the new Bar year.

Features to be Considered in Personal Injury Related Trusts

There are a number of considerations when a personal injury trust is being utilized in connection with a personal injury recovery. The types of trusts commonly used are:

- >> Special Needs Trust. A Special Needs Trust (SNT) is for an individual receiving, or who may be eligible to receive, meanstested public benefits such as SSI, Medicaid, Federally Assisted Housing, and SNAP (Food Stamps).
- > Settlement Protection Trust. A Settlement Protection Trust (SPT) is used when there is a plaintiff who is a minor or incapacitated adult, or if the plaintiff wants help in investing the money and preventing him or her from squandering it.
- >> Settlement Protection Trust with Special Needs Provisions. In some instances, the Settlement Protection Trust with Special Needs Provisions (SPT with SNT) is utilized. An example would be where the plaintiff is under age 18 and is not eligible for SSI and Medicaid because of parental deeming until the child attains age 18. In those situations, the Settlement Protection Subtrust, which is fairly flexible, can be utilized until the child's 18th birthday, at which time the funds will be transferred by the trustee into the Special Needs Subtrust.
- > Settlement Protection Trust with Special Needs and Medicare-Set Aside Provisions. There are occasions where there may be a Settlement Protection Trust with Special Needs and Medicare Set-Aside (MSA) Provisions (SPT with SPT and MSA). These would be cases where the plaintiff may be receiving public benefits in

- the future but needs an MSA. Some Courts hold that the MSA is a countable resource precluding the plaintiff from receiving public benefits. If the MSA is embedded in the Special Needs Trust, it is not a countable asset.
- >> Special Needs Trust with Medicare Set-Aside Provisions. Some trusts are simply Special Needs Trusts with MSA Provisions (SNT with MSA).

In designing these trusts, certain features should be considered.

- > Who Should Serve as Trustee? A professional trustee should always be considered for a Personal Injury-Related Trust. The professional trustee has expertise in investment management, taxation, and navigating the system to support the injured party. Courts will usually not require any bond for a professional trustee.
- > Trust Protector. A trust protector should be appointed whenever there is a corporate trustee. The trust protector should be given the authority to remove and replace the professional trustee in the event that the relationship proves to be unsatisfactory. Knowing that the trustee can be removed is comforting to the beneficiary.
- > Compensation. Each professional trustee publishes a Standard Schedule of Charges for the services of a trustee. It is usually a declining sliding scale based on the size of the trust assets under management. It should be noted that these trustee commissions are generally comparable to, and often less expensive than, those charged by any investment manager or even mutual funds. A good trustee will provide personal attention to the trust beneficiary.



- > Limited Power of Appointment. The Personal Injury-Related Trust should give a beneficiary who has capacity a limited power of appointment. This means that the injured party can execute a will disposing of the assets in the trust upon death. It may be better to give the injured party the limited power of appointment than to have the trust document determine who will receive the funds on the death of the beneficiary, because the injured party can exercise the appointment from time to time and change the disposition of assets as he or she sees fit. It should be noted that estate planning is crucial in the settlement of a personal injury case, particularly where Federal and State estate and inheritance taxes are involved.
- > Revocable/Irrevocable. An SNT and an SNT with MSA must be irrevocable from inception. An SPT could be revocable by the injured party, if the party has capacity, or it could be irrevocable. If one of the goals is to protect against squandering assets, it is advisable to make the trust irrevocable. However, once the Special Needs Subtrust is funded, the Special Needs Subtrust must be irrevocable.
- > Grantor Trust. Any of the Personal Injury-Related Trusts can be a grantor trust, which means that, for income tax purposes, it is ignored. The income tax treatment of the income and deductions pertaining to the trust are the same as they would be if there was no trust. The grantor picks up the income and deductions on his or her personal tax returns.

Forgotten Property? You Might Not Need a Forensic Accountant For This... But Call If You Do

When retained to help administer an estate or just garnering assets, we will often (like just last week) search for unclaimed property. Hey, if we know this, why shouldn't you?

What are we talking about? Well, if a business, government, bank, or other institution owes you money but can't get in contact with you, they may turn the money over to your state government. Most states we know protect unclaimed money and hold it until it is claimed by the rightful owner. If your state is holding on to money that belongs to you, it's due to a federally mandated process called escheatment. According to escheatment rules, abandoned or forgotten property must be turned over to the state after a dormancy period has elapsed.

Start your free search for unclaimed money with your state's unclaimed property office. If you'd rather not search for your state's site, the NAUPA (National Association of Unclaimed Property Administrators) has a handy directory. Simply select your state on their interactive map and you'll be redirected to your state's database. You can also do a free search on the websites www.MissingMoney.com or www.Unclaimed.org, which are both endorsed by the NAUPA feature collective records from all stateheld unclaimed property. Frankly, we suggest you also check other states you've lived in or done business in. Other companies that claim to offer access to unclaimed funds (and which assess a fee) are often just scams.


Holders of Unclaimed Property are financial institutions, insurers, utilities, business associations, medical facilities, sole proprietors, fiduciaries, courts, public officers, government entities and all legal or commercial entities that must file a report with the state if they have reportable unclaimed property. These items and funds go missing, often for things as simple as a misspelled name or an out-of-date address. But let's be clear: this is YOUR money we're talking about.

These funds may be bank or brokerage accounts, uncashed payroll checks, uncashed dividend checks, CDs, contents of safe deposit boxes, insurance policies, annuities, trust funds, unredeemed money orders, utility deposits, refunds or the many other types of assets covered under the particular state's statute. Tangible property are physical assets such as collectible coins, jewelry, military medals, stamps, antiques, savings bonds or other physical items. The State only acts as a custodian of these funds until the rightful owner(s) can be located, verified, and the assets are returned. If you locate unclaimed property belonging to you or you have the legal capacity to claim an asset belonging to someone else, you can submit a claim in just a few simple steps. Unclaimed assets are reported in the name or Social Security number of the owner(s) along with any owner information (if available).

So, here's what your forensic accountants suggest you do:

- Search for unclaimed money and property in states where you have lived or worked.
- Check for unclaimed funds from bank failures or unclaimed deposits from credit union closures.
- Check for unclaimed back wages, pension money, or life insurance funds.
- Search for unclaimed or undelivered tax refunds (federal or state) or search for a refund from an FHA-insured mortgage.
- If you're married, check under your maiden name. Using a first initial and your last name is also encouraged to make sure everything comes up.

The claims process is much simpler if the owner of the unclaimed property is still living, so we encourage our clients to do searches on themselves and their loved ones periodically. However, if you are wanting to claim funds on behalf of a lost loved one, you will need to have access to this documents/information of him/her:

- A copy of the death certificate;
- His/her social security number;
- A copy of his/her id (driver's license)
- Proof of address- showing that your loved one lived at the address on the claim;
- A copy of the obituary.



When we talk about the "ABCs" we often are referring 🔻 avoid flabbiness. The wines tend to offer plum and to something that is very basic or foundational, as in children learning their ABCs as they embark on years or, for those extending their studies beyond college, many decades of education. In the world of wine, these introductory letters of the alphabet came to be used dismissively when discussing a wine commonly opened at the table or gathering - Anything But Chardonnay! There are many explanations offered for this expression, whether a desire to try something different than the very popular Chardonnay wines or as a protest from the increasing use of oak when making wines from this grape and how the wood can overpower the fruit. While perhaps less common, it is an expression sometimes used when discussing a favorite red wine grape, Cabernet Sauvignon, as in Anything But Cabernet.

When learning the ABCs of wine and avoiding falling into a rut of common grape choices, we can start by identifying other varieties having names that begin with those letters. One of the increasingly popular "A" grapes is Albariňo, or Alvarinho as it is known in Portugal. While Albariňo is grown elsewhere, it is best known as the leading white wine grape in the Rias Baixas region in Galicia in northeastern Spain. It is an area that abuts and therefore is influenced by the ocean, and many of the wines possess bracing acidity and salinity, with fruit impressions that include lemon, lemon zest, honeydew melon, nectarines, and sometimes gentle grapefruit tones. An estate that some years ago Linda and I visited that really impressed us is Zarate. While the winery makes a wide variety of wines, the one most commonly available to us is the entry level Albariňo, and it most definitely merits your buying consideration. Other producers to consider include Bodegas Granbázan, Bodegas la Cana, Pazo de Seňorans, Bodegas La Val, Coto De Gomariz, and Paco & Lola.

If you want to try an off-the-beaten path red wine from the "A" list, perhaps you may enjoy a wine made from Greece's Agiorgitiko grape. Given the fact that the grape's spelling does not match how non-Greeks would pronounce it (it is pronounced I-yor-YEEti-ko}, it is unsurprising that some producers will label their versions after the rough translation of the name, Saint George, which actually is a chapel in the heartland for the grape, Nemea. Another alternative to labeling the wine by its challenging varietal name is for Nemea producers to simply use that regional name. Last September, Linda and I enjoyed sitting down and tasting with George Skouras at his winery during a visit that coincided with an annual regional festival, "Great Days of Nemea." Agiorgitiko handles Mediterranean heat well, but the better wines are grown at elevation to enable the wines to retain the acidity necessary to

red fruits, cocoa, and can be distinctively spicy, with gentle tannins allowing the depth of the fruit flavors to take center stage. Besides Skouras, two other wineries we visited in Nemea whose Agiorgitikos are worth searching out include Gai'a and Semeli. More difficult to find but also meriting consideration are Pavlidis, Tselepos (also under the Driopi label), Palivou, and Papaioannou.

Moving on in the alphabet, let's talk about two red grape varieties that begin with the letter "B." Barbera is a workhorse grape that enjoys its biggest success in Italy's Piedmont region. While it usually sits in the shadows of Barolo and Barbaresco, wines made from the Nebbiolo grape, that deservedly enjoy the spotlight in this northern Italian wine region, Barbera offers a much more affordable and often more reliable option when looking for a red wine to pair with dishes that call for wines possessing complementary acidity. The hightoned nature of the wines and their moderate tannins cause the fruit to be quite vivid, with brambly qualities overlaying sharply defined red fruit impressions such as wild strawberries or raspberries and dried cherries, often with a mushroom and mineral presence, particularly if the wine has some age. While more "serious" wines often see some barrel aging, and those from specific regions such as Asti and Alba can elevate the varietal in quality and price, many Barberas are made for early consumption at favorable prices. During the past several vintages, the Gianfranco Alessandria Barbera has offered excellent quality at a bargain price. Indeed, I poured it at a recent charity tasting and it was quite popular. Most of our better wine stores will carry a host of other Barberas from well-regarded producers such as Domenico Clerico, G.D. Vajra, Vietti (Tre Vigne from both Asti and Alba), Michele Chiarlo, Mauro Veglio, Moccagatta, La Spinetta (labeled as Ca' di Pian), Pico Maccario, and Pio Cesare.

Further afield we can look to Central Europe, and particularly Austria, for wines made from the Blaufrankisch grape. This is a somewhat vigorous but late-ripening grape that can be densely fruity and possess lively acidity and healthy tannins. Typical fruit profiles include red currants and blackberries that are more primary when the wine is young but with some time in bottle or glass can be augmented by notes of allspice and black pepper. It is a wine that pairs well with sausage, lamb, and grilled meats. It also is grown in Germany where it usually is called Lemberger, a grape name and planting that also has found favor in Washington State. Among Austrian versions of wines from this grape worth seeking out are those fashioned by Prieler, Glatzer, Wachter-Wiesler, and Heidi Schröck.



Finally, let's take a look at two wines made from "C" grapes that offer alternatives to Chardonnay or Cabernet Sauvignon. As mentioned in a past column, one of the more interesting wine regions Linda and I visited was Mt. Etna in Sicily. There more than anywhere else, the Carricante grape thrives. Left uncontrolled, the vines will over-produce grapes leaving the wine diluted and uninteresting, but when managed by quality-conscious vintners, the results can be rewarding. One key to a grape succeeding in a hot climate such as Sicily is elevation, and the best Carricante vineyards are well up the slope of the volcano where the diurnal temperature range (warm days and cooler nights) allows for proper ripening. Many producers fashion wines that are unoaked but see malolactic fermentation (the conversion of sharper lactic acid into creamier malic acid). This approach allows the acidity to remain vibrant while the taste impressions are more expansive, often offering notes of green apples, citrus, barely ripe peaches, and fennel, sometimes accented by streaks of white flowers and a nutty salinity. Among producers who, particularly for their entry level wines, raise the wines in stainless steel are Benanti, Alta Mora, Pietradolce, and Tasca l'Almerita. While it is priced above the level many may want to spend for a wine made from Carricante, the Planeta Carricante Eruzione 1614 can take the grape to another level of expression. If a winemaker wants the wine to offer more power and structure, they may employ the use of oak barrels in the fermentation



and/or aging of the wines. Wineries who may take this approach include **Alberto Graci** and **Tenuta della Terre Nere**. It should be mentioned that many wineries will label their Carricante as Etna Bianco, either because it is more recognizable or because the wine includes a small percentage of other varieties, often Catarrato or in the case of the Planeta, Riesling.

Let's close by focusing on a red grape that deserves more attention than it receives, Carignan (Car-[as in carry]-in-yan). This is a grape that once was widely planted in France, particularly in the south, until in the late 20th century it became a victim of Merlot's increasing popularity. Because of its high acidity and brisk tannins, it often is viewed as a grape to add as part of a blend where those qualities need to be enhanced, often in support of Grenache, Syrah, and/or Mourvèdre. It is a grape that ripens late, often from over productive vines, and is susceptible to disease. This likely has helped accelerate its decline in favor of easier to grow and more popular varietals. Its identity also can be obscured by the fact it has different names depending on where it grows. It is planted in Spain's famous Rioja region, where it is called Mazuelo and where it often will be blended with that area's flagship Tempranillo grape. Carignan has become an increasingly important grape in two other regions of Spain, Priorat and Montsant, located in the northeastern area of Catalonia, where it is known as Cariňena. The grape also has found a home in Sardinia, where it is called Carignano. Naturally, the impressions the grape conveys will vary from region to region with their different terroirs, but some of the qualities one may find include spice-driven red fruit, woodsy and earthy undercurrents, dusty tannins, and a gamey impression that can either seem rustic or complex, depending on how it is handled or how it is perceived by the taster. While it can be a vigorous vine, many of the vineyards still producing the grapes are old, some very old, which reduces the number of grapes produced and correspondingly adds dimension and complexity to the grapes they yield. One of the real bargain French Carignan wines is the old vine bottling of Domaine Lafage under his Tessellae label. Other wineries achieving success that have local availability include Hecht & Bannier, Domaine des Tourelles, and Domaine des d'Aupilhac. In Sardinia, a quality effort is that of Tenute Sella & Mosca. Some of the more accomplished, and more expensive, producers of Carignan or wines having a healthy percentage of the grape, are in Spain's Priorat and Montsant regions. Among those wineries utilizing Cariñena successfully include Vall Llach, Mas Doix, Terroir Al, Mas d'en Gil, LimitScala Dei, Bodegas Mas Alta, Bodegas La Cartuja, Costers del Priorat, Ferrer Bobet, and Black Slate. While their lofty reputations allow for elevated prices, since they also employ the grape, usually as part of a blend, we should at least mention Alvaro Palacios, Clos Erasmus, Clos Mogador, and Mas Martinet.

Perhaps during your summer break, you may want to practice your ABCs and rather than drinking wines that you comfortably know, stray from the familiar. In doing so, you can further expand your wine horizons and perhaps find a new favorite house wine. Have a great summer!

LRS Practice Categories

The LRS has 5 primary categories and over 35 special area categories. Each is considered a separate panel. Referrals within each panel rotate on a strict "next up" basis, with the only exceptions being those described in Rule 5A. Rotations occur within the 5 primary categories by the subgroups listed. Applicants should indicate each specific area of the law in which he/she wishes to receive referrals by checking the box next to all areas from which referrals are sought.

Referrals rotate within each of the special area panels independently of the others. For example, if a panelist requests referrals in all of the 5 primary categories and in 5 special categories, he/she will rotate within 10 panels simultaneously. This attorney could possibly receive referrals from each panel independent of the others according to the rotation. Once a referral is made in any one of the subcategories of a primary panel, the attorney will automatically be moved to the bottom of the rotation for that category.

When completing this application, in addition to checking the primary practice area boxes, be sure to indicate the specific areas of interest within each category. Remember that you should only indicate areas in which your practice, experience and education permit you to represent clients competently as required by the Code of Professional Responsibility. You will receive referrals in indicated categories only.
