

## A Reminder of What to Look for When Reading a Valuation Report

You're in the beginning stages of helping a client sell his company, Tax E, Vader's No Wax Flooring, Inc. You recommended a business valuator to get an idea of what the business is worth (perhaps Abo Cipolla Financial Forensics, LLC). Abo delivers the report. Now what?

The value appears to be in the ballpark, but what do the report's details mean? Whatever the reason for a valuation, a basic understanding of the report's content means there's no need to take it at face value.

### Four Points of Interest

In today's fast-paced business environment, it's not uncommon for business owners to quickly scan a valuation report, searching for the final figure. But you can learn much more from a report if you know what to look for throughout. Here are four key areas within the document we think business owners as well as all of their advisors may wish to at least consider focusing on:

**1. Procedures.** A business valuator will visit the site as well as perform a detailed financial analysis. Any information the valuator uses should have been available — or at least foreseeable — at the valuation's "as of" date.

**2. Methodology.** With various valuation approaches available, valuers choose one based on a company's unique characteristics. The valuation

report, a "conclusion of value" really should discuss all of the valuator's options, including why some methodologies may be more appropriate than others.

**3. Discounts.** Once the valuator applies a methodology, he or she determines whether to apply valuation discounts (or premiums) to the preliminary value. Common discounts include the minority interest and marketability. If the valuator applies discounts, he or she should detail why each was chosen, any empirical evidence available and the company's unique characteristics.

**4. Conclusion.** After all is said and done, the value conclusion should make economic sense, at least considering both the hypothetical buyer and the hypothetical seller.

In addition to these four areas, also look in the "conclusion of value" report for the definition of the entity being valued. This definition should include the valuation's purpose, the company's name, the number of shares or interest, the entity type and the "as of" date.

Readers of the report should also be on the lookout for what professional "standards" were employed.

Business valuers affiliated with a nationally recognized business valuation organization, such as a CVA (Certified Valuation Analyst) from the National Association of Certified Valuers and Analysts (NACVA); an ABV (Accredited in Business Valuation) from the American

# WINE & FOOD

Last month, we left our discussion of Bordeaux Blanc wines by noting that since most people associate Bordeaux with the red wines produced there, reviewing some of the more affordable Bordeaux Rouge wines probably is long overdue. The difficulty of determining when to explore these wines is knowing when the latest vintage or vintages can be found on the shelves of our local retailers or, for that matter, in the inventory of some of the larger and more prominent online wine sellers. The best opportunity I have to taste Bordeaux wines on a large scale is at the annual Union Grands Crus Bordeaux (“UGCB”) tasting (or vintage reveal as the organization calls it) that is held in several cities each January. I have been fortunate over the years to be able to attend the New York City event where many of the Union members present their wines from an upcoming vintage.

Bordeaux is a large region of wineries (many of which feature impressive chateaux they incorporate into their name and on their label) that release their wines at different times based on their standing in the Bordeaux community. This often is a function of where the vineyards are located, the varieties of grapes grown, and the aging regimen employed. The UGCB members include many of the more famous “classified growth” estates and, as the name suggests, the “reveal” of the wines from upcoming vintages means that the wines from these estates typically aren’t immediately released to the marketplace. At the 2024 event, wines from the 2021 vintage were poured, and the 2025 tasting presented wines from the 2022 vintage. While climate change and viticultural knowledge and technology have helped wineries everywhere, including in Bordeaux, to manage growing conditions better and achieve increasingly good outcomes, 2021 and 2022 are nevertheless very different Bordeaux vintages.

As a quick refresher, the red wines of Bordeaux are made using several allowed grape varieties, with the composition of the wines influenced by which side of the Gironde estuary and the two rivers that flow into it the vineyards are planted. The Gironde estuary empties into the Atlantic Ocean and is fed by two rivers, the Garonne to the west and the Dordogne to the east. In general terms, the soil on the left side of the Gironde and south of the Garonne is composed of mostly gravel and stone, which suits Cabernet Sauvignon vines. It is here the so termed “Left Bank” wines, including the famous “First Growths,” are found. To the right of the Gironde and north of the Dordogne the so called “Right Bank” soil tends to be heavier in clay, with areas of limestone and sand, conditions more suitable for the Merlot (and Cabernet Franc) grapevines that thrive there.

Therefore, depending upon your grape preferences, knowing a little bit about the geography of Bordeaux may help inform your wine buying.

The 2021 vintage on both “banks” of the Bordeaux region often is described as “classic,” which sounds impressive but actually means the wines are less fruit forward and more likely to have their tannic structure initiating the impression they offer when opened. Critics tend to view the vintage overall as very good but also somewhat irregular, as each estate handled the growing conditions with varying degrees of success. The weather in 2021 involved early frost followed by unseasonably cool weather leading to late ripening of the grapes. A further complication was that during the spring and summer there were prolonged wet and humid conditions which could expose vineyards to a variety of plant diseases. Even if the winery managed to avoid crop damage, the unfavorable weather still resulted in many wines having higher acidity, lower alcohol, and firmer tannins. In contrast, 2022 was very hot and dry, causing early ripening, smaller berries, and reduced yields, factors which often resulted in wines possessing concentrated fruit impressions that are balanced by ripe tannins. Provided the winery picked its grapes before they were overripe, it had a chance to make wines of exceptional quality. The differences between these two vintages reminds me of how 1988 and 1989 Bordeaux Rouge wines contrast with each other, with 1988 the more “classic” vintage compared to the more opulent wines of 1989.

Recognizing that American consumers likely are more familiar with the often more fruit-driven style of California Cabernets, the 2022 vintage may have more fans in our country than the more restrained 2021s. However, since one of the ways we can expand our wine horizons is to explore wines which may be less familiar or that offer qualities different from those we typically enjoy, let’s have a look at some 2021 Bordeaux Rouge that succeeded in overcoming nature’s challenges to make wines that should also offer good value. In fact, to the extent that the 2021 Bordeaux Rouge failed to arouse buyer enthusiasm before the arrival of the 2022 wines, pricing may be even more favorable.

While they may not be the top Right Bank performers, here are three estates from the commune of Saint-Emilion that outperform their cost. **2021 Chateau Berliquet** is a solid effort, with fruit that leans toward dark berries escorted by mineral and saline qualities with a crisp acidity that promotes a lingering finish. The wine is usually around two-thirds Merlot and the rest Cabernet Franc, a grape that can offer distinctly green qualities if it is not well-ripened. The fact

that there is little herbal presence, but rather more floral undercurrents, suggests the winery handled the growing conditions deftly. This small estate was purchased by the House of Chanel in 2017, and while it may take more time and investment to enable the winery to truly deserve its Grand Cru status, for now it can win fans by its combination of quality and affordability. The **2021 Chateau Grand Mayne** provides a bit more richness with fruit that is red and fleshy, with raspberry and red currants most prominently featured in the wine’s solidly constructed frame. This wine employs more Merlot in its blend and uses slightly more new oak than the Berliquet, features that may contribute to the wine’s added depth and lift. Finally, a wine that struck me as being more in line with the characteristics of the vintage is **2021 Chateau Larcis Ducasse**. There is a noticeable intensity to the grip and an herbal quality that while evident is harnessed sufficiently well to avoid distraction. There is an overriding dark and brambly fruit presence that is energetic and expansive, serving to once again support the view that the winery was able to combat disease pressures and bring the grapes to a healthy level of ripeness.

Heading over to the Cabernet Sauvignon focused Left Bank, the **2021 Chateau Les Ormes de Pez** features darker fruit resembling black currants and black cherries, with some game notes and an interplay of toasty spices. While there seems to be an oak influence on the wine’s texture, it is accomplished without imparting the drying tannins that oak can create. The winery is in the commune of Saint-Estèphe, which can often yield wines that are tighter and more backward on release. This effort, however, seems quite forthcoming and approachable, particularly for the vintage.


The Bordeaux appellations that often offer the best value are those from less heralded communes, and a nice performer in the small Lustrac-Médoc appellation is the **2021 Chateau Fourcas Dupré**. This wine customarily is a blend of equal parts Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot and offers considerable quality for the modest price it commands. The vineyards drain exceptionally well, undoubtedly a virtue in such a wet year. It exhibits nicely ripened red fruit in a surprisingly ample body that features a juicy profile that overshadows the lurking tannins to keep them in the background.

# A Reminder of What to Look for When Reading a Valuation Report

Institute of CPAs (AICPA); or an Accredited Senior Appraiser from the American Society of Appraisers (ASA) are all required to adhere to industry standards.

Standards protect users of valuation services by providing a mechanism with which to regulate us practitioners' conduct and work quality. Practitioners affiliated with a valuation organization are subject to disciplinary action for non-compliance to standards and could lose their certification for flagrant departures. While no one currently at Abo Cipolla Financial Forensics is an ASA which we understand has very similar standards, we can tell you our ABV and CVA designations dictate we look for guidance to the standards promulgated by the AICPA and NACVA which address all aspects of members' work product, including:

- Professional conduct

- Executing consulting and litigation engagements
- Performing a business valuation, starting with obtaining the information required to understand the business and scope of the engagement, moving through to the analysis phase which includes the methodology used and other important technical considerations
- Identifying any scope limitations
- Reporting the conclusions drawn from the analysis

The ABV and CVA were and are not that easy to obtain and require a great deal to so maintain by us and our very credible colleagues. The ABO? Well, that was a bit easier.



**2021 Chateau Maucaillou** is from another less vaunted Left Bank appellation, Moulis-en-Médoc, and once again the grape blend tends to be around 50% Cabernet Sauvignon with Merlot making up most of the balance. This wine offers salinized plum fruit with black tea tones that complement rather than distract from the lively fruit impressions. Nearby, as it often does the **2021 Chateau Poujeaux** also performs above its standing in the Bordeaux hierarchy, offering tart cranberry fruit augmented by ripe raspberries and cassis. This mélange of fruit impressions carries a plumpness that provides weight without losing the structural support of the ripe tannins or detracting from the taut finish.

Finally, let's have a look at the **2021 Chateau La Tour de By**, which is in a northerly appellation called Médoc. This is likely a source of some confusion since Médoc is commonly used to refer to the entire Left Bank. One way the small official appellation could be distinguished from the broader geographical reference would be to use the term "Bas Médoc" as it once was called, but current regulations do not allow that. *C'est ainsi!* As for this winery, like many Bordeaux estates, vineyards long have been planted here, in this case since the 16th century. This northern part of Bordeaux is closer to the Atlantic Ocean where the Gironde Estuary widens, and the "Tour" here refers to a tower on the property that used to be a lighthouse. The vineyards are comprised of approximately 60% Cabernet Sauvignon with 35% Merlot and 5% Petit Verdot, and production is sizeable enough to allow for a good economy of scale. This wine captures attention with a deep ruby red color that foretells the cassis fruit one often finds in Cabernet Sauvignon, accompanied by graphite notes commonly found in Left Bank Bordeaux Rouge. Flirting around the edges of the fruit is a dusting of black pepper. It is a wine that while simple in

structure still has enough depth and signature qualities to give it the gravitas one associates with Bordeaux.

Since the more "serious" 2022 Bordeaux Rouge are now also finding their way to market, we will have to put discussing the wines from this more heralded vintage on our "to do" list. Cheers!
