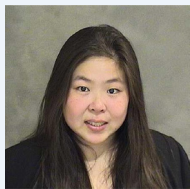


JEANETTE KWON TO BE INSTALLED AS 100TH PRESIDENT

After completing her clerkship, Kwon went on to practice at the Office of the Public Defender as an Assistant Deputy Public Defender from September 2012 to May 2023.

Camden County's Professional Lawyer Award was named by the trustees in memory of past CCBA President Harvey M. Mitnick who passed away in 2014. Harvey was the 1998 Camden County Professional Lawyer of the Year.

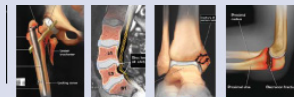

Til Death Due Us Part... Oh Yeh, I Remember Saying That

Yep, as of now Marty Abo has been married some 343 dog years but Janie Abo is keeping me in line. Still, obtaining a divorce does not necessarily mean that two people who find that they are incompatible have to undergo extended emotional and financial pain. Intelligent couples are increasingly taking a mature approach to their problem and to devising a fair resolution. The approach typically may include actions (among many others) such as:

- Consulting a marriage counselor to determine whether the marriage is salvageable and to minimize anger or emotional damage for either partner.
- Obtaining information about the state's divorce laws. (While but a "bridge away", it's incredible how New Jersey differs from Pennsylvania differs from New York differs from Delaware....)
- Considering the use of experts seasoned in the practice of Alternative Dispute Resolution such as mediation or those trained in interdisciplinary collaborative practice (feel free to ask us for the names of credible professionals who have shown us they communicate well and facilitate resolution rather than fuel the hostility).
- Obtaining separate attorneys conversant with divorce law to ensure each party's interests are protected.
- Reaching an agreement between the spouses to accept a single appraisal of marital assets because this can avoid substantial appraisal fees. As an aside, even when we are selected as a jointly retained forensic accountant/business appraiser, we often still encourage the

non-property spouse to at least confer with another professional ensuring they have someone on their side to explain the analysis to see how it might affect their particular position(s).

- Assessing the tax consequences of property settlements.
- Having both spouses prepare a net worth affidavit that includes budgetary living expenses, and a listing of assets and liabilities. (Different states have varying requirements.)
- Reviewing the tax consequences of alimony for the parties (yep, even with the law change effective January 1, 2018, issues can still pop up in the matrimonial arena).
- Reaching an amicable dissolution of the marriage.
- Of course, when there are children involved, the problems become more complicated. Consideration needs to be given to who has custody of the children, the amount of support payments provided by the non-custodial parent, the tax and financial consequences of either parent claiming dependency, and the psychological impact of the family separation on the children.

There are some great colleagues in this in this space but we too are frequently consulted on the tax and financial aspects of alternative divorce arrangements or to evaluate business interests, making every effort to provide constructive advice that benefits each of the parties. Even when we are not jointly retained, how beneficial we've found it when attorneys for both sides get in touch with the forensic accountants/appraisers early on, allowing us to share information. At least this enables the accountants to "agree where they disagree".

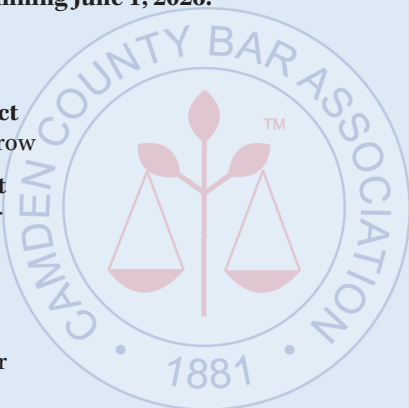

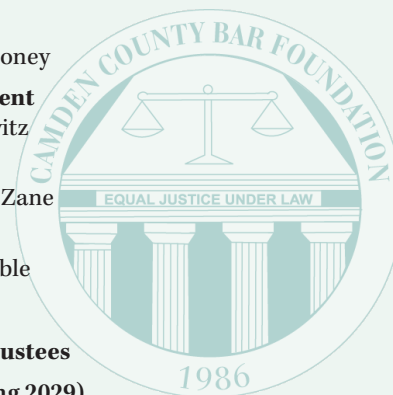

WINE & FOOD

In the first Wine and Food column published in 1995 (yikes!), I suggested that one way to increase the odds of successfully buying an unfamiliar foreign wine is to look on the label (often the back label) to determine what importer brought the wine to our market. I had suggested some companies worth knowing because they have the desire and ability to be selective with the wineries they represent, thereby increasing the chance that you will be pleased with the purchase of wines they distribute. Over the years changes have occurred in the wine distribution industry, often due to mergers or consolidations, so some of the companies mentioned then no longer exist. However, the company now known as Skurnik Wines & Spirits not only has survived but thrived. Michael Skurnik began the business in 1987 and was joined by his brother, Harmon, in 1989. If you were a reader of this column in 2011 and have a steel trap memory, you will recall that Harmon graciously agreed to be interviewed and we were able to gain meaningful insight into the way the company began, evolved, and from its inception succeeded. While for many reasons an importer's portfolio of producers is never static, the Skurniks have managed over the years to maintain a winery lineup that is impressive in its breadth, depth, and most important, quality.

After a Covid-inspired hiatus when bringing thousands of people together continued to be a challenge, portfolio tastings slowly returned, although sometimes on a smaller scale. However, the Skurniks recently brought many of its winemakers or winery representatives to New York City for what they appropriately called a Grand Portfolio Tasting that I was eager to attend. The cancellation of the train I planned to take delayed my arrival and abridged the time I could spend moving from table to table to hunt for wines I thought may be of interest to you. This was not a small challenge since there was a large crowd of people vying to taste many of the more than 1,400 wines being poured. While I did spend some time catching up with some of the winemakers one gets to know over many years of face-to-face tastings, I still managed to taste many wines that offer exceptional value and hopefully will be available without too much searching. Let's talk about some of them.

2023 Paul Blanck Pinot Blanc d'Alsace offers very ripe stone fruit impressions led by white peaches augmented by hints of Bosc pear and honeydew melon. While the fruit is forward, the wine manages to remain quite crisp in its delivery. As often is the case, a wine that achieves a balance between broad and deep fruit and a lively acidity is poised to please.

When France's Loire Valley is mentioned, several wine

appellations may come to mind. Among the better-known wine producing areas of this expansive region are, from east to west, Sancerre and Pouilly Fume, Vouvray, and Chinon. Three of the more popular grape varieties grown are the white grapes Sauvignon Blanc and Chenin Blanc and the red grape Cabernet Franc. Vouvray wines are made from the Chenin Blanc grape and can be vinified to be dry, semi-dry, or sweet ("moelleux"). Sparkling Vouvray also has become more popular over the years as an option for those wanting a less expensive French alternative to Champagne. However, across the Loire River from Vouvray and still somewhat in the shadow it casts is Montlouis-sur-Loire, where Chenin Blanc also thrives, and it is here that Le Rocher des Violettes was founded in 2005. The winery has a lineup of wines from grapes commonly grown throughout the region, but its focus is on Chenin Blanc. While all the wines I tasted were worth buying, let's limit our discussion to the two least expensive ones. **2023 Le Rocher des Violettes Vin de France Chenin Blanc** displays admirable richness for an entry level wine, with ripe apple fruit melding with early picked apricots that are framed by a slate focused minerality that serves to reinforce the dry fruit profile while also helping to carry the taste to a clean finish. **2023 Le Rocher des Violettes Touraine Cabernet Franc** is very Chinon-like at a fraction of the cost. It yields tart, gripping, Bing cherry fruit with faint olive and pepper notes that lurk in the background. This very impressive effort is at once penetrating yet is broad enough to allow the fruit to remain in the spotlight.

Famille Dubard is a winery I have touted in the past, and so I was glad I managed to find Gregory and Marine Dubard pouring their wines. This small winery is in southwestern France, east and slightly north of the famous Bordeaux region. Marine is the winemaker, and since each of the three wines made offers excellent value, let's cover them all. The wine most likely to be available is one I have enjoyed in many past vintages, the **2024 Famille Dubard Coeur du Mont Sauvignon Blanc**. If you like the white wines of Sancerre but balk at the prices, this can be a nice and appreciably less expensive alternative. It is a viscous wine featuring gooseberry and lemon fruit that has more flesh and is less aggressive than many comparably priced Sauvignon Blancs. There are perhaps touches of sage and a quiet sense of meadow, and it balances its somewhat firm grip with clean and broad waves of fruit. **2025 Famille Dubard Coeur du Mont Rosé**, fashioned from Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon, is a bit more muscular than the more delicate wines of nearby Provence. There are red currant fruit and notes of garrigue conveyed in a textured and

composed manner. It has a solid structure that reinforces, rather than obscures, the depth of fruit the wine possesses. Finally, **2024 Famille Dubard Coeur du Mont Pinot Noir** exhibits a deft handling of a grape that can be difficult to grow and harvest and is a variety not commonly found in a region where sturdier grapes such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, or Malbec are featured. Certainly, this is not Burgundy in style, but it sells for perhaps one-third the cost of a basic Bourgogne Rouge. It conveys impressions of soft and ripe black cherry and raspberry fruit with whispers of chalk and violets. While it is a bit bolder than many French Pinot Noirs, it nevertheless remains poised and graceful.

A winery with which I had been unfamiliar but was very glad to encounter is Huia Estate from New Zealand. There is no shortage of New Zealand wine, particularly Sauvignon Blanc, found in area wine stores. While Cloudy Bay often is credited with opening the world's eyes to that nation's wine potential, particularly for its signature grape variety, countless competitors have followed the path blazed by Cloudy Bay. The most prominent New Zealand wine region is Marlborough on the South Island, and it is here that so many of the top wineries producing Sauvignon Blanc can be found, and Huia is among them. It was established in 1994 and began producing its first wines in 1996. Huia is a sacred bird of honor of the Māori, and drawings of it are featured on the label. While the winery has been around for over 30 years, it was purchased by Tom Pegler in 2022, and his recruitment of a new winemaker and vineyard manager along with Skurnik's marketing and distribution prowess should lead to a heightened presence in our country. While its Sauvignon Blanc is a nice option in a crowded field, I preferred two other white wines. **2024 Huia Vineyards Tangle** is an interesting blend that varies each year. This vintage is made from Sauvignon Blanc, Riesling, Viognier, and Pinot Gris, and it untangles nicely onto the palate. There is a chalky dusting of citric fruit with honeysuckle nuances that expand in the mouth to complement its lively and expressive ripeness. **2024 Huia Vineyards Pinot Gris** is another solid effort featuring ample flesh and richness to the smoky fruit that hints of baked apples and barely ripened pears that linger as the nice acidity carries them to a conclusion.

New Amendments to New Jersey Custody Statute

On January 20, 2026, the New Jersey custody statute was amended. The statutory amendments will now require that the safety and preferences of each child be of primary concern when addressing custody matters. While the preferences of the child and safety concerns were always relevant to a custody determination, the statutory amendments emphasize these concerns and provide specific procedures to ensure same. While “safety” was always a factor for the court to consider, now the statute specifically requires that all “... judicial decisions regarding custody of, and access to, children... promote the safety of children as a threshold issue.” The safety of New Jersey children is, accordingly, no longer simply a factor, amongst others, for the court to consider. Now, “the safety of children is of paramount importance and is an integral element of the child’s best interest.”

The other major substantive change concerns the child’s expressed preferences. While the old custody statute required that a child be of sufficient age and maturity to make an informed decision before the court would be required to consider the child’s preferences, now; presumably at any age, the Judge hearing the custody matter will be required to specifically place on the record the factors which justify the arrangement and which justify the court’s decision to disregard the child’s expressed preferences.

Procedurally, in support of the new emphasis on safety and preferences, the new statute permits input from treating state licensed mental health professionals to support the child’s expressed preferences, including letters from a treating state licensed mental health professional and, presumably, any other documents that the treating state licensed mental health professional may deem relevant to the child’s safety and/or expressed preferences. The new statutory amendments also limit a parent’s ability to argue that the other parent has somehow alienated the affections of the child, by parent alienation or otherwise. The new statute specifically prohibits the court from “...presuming that any child’s reluctance to interact with a party was caused by the other party”, absent input from a qualified treating therapist reflecting same. Also, now the courts are prohibited from granting increased custody for purposes of improving the relationship between the

child and one party and/or to address the child’s reluctance to interact with any party, whenever there is “evidence of a history of domestic violence or child abuse.” Courts will accordingly now be more focused on the children’s safety rather than reunification of children with an estranged parent, whenever there is any history of domestic violence or child abuse.

The amended custody statute also significantly impacts if and how our New Jersey courts will consider input from therapists and/or mental health professionals in custody matters. First, the court may now only order therapy with a “state licensed mental health professional.” While this “state licensed mental health professional” may coordinate or consult with any treating therapist for the parents and/or the child, the “state licensed mental health professional” must possess “substantial training and experience” in matters involving domestic violence and/or child abuse, for the court to consider their input. The amended statute also now empowers the Court to order that the therapist “...report to the court, on a periodic basis as determined by the court, regarding the progress of therapy, including but not limited to, the parties’ and the child’s willingness to participate in therapy.”

The amended statute also limits what types of therapy our courts may now order and/or consider in the context of custody matters. The amendments prohibit the use of “any therapy unless there is generally accepted and scientifically valid proof of the safety, effectiveness, and therapeutic value of the therapy.” Now, concerned caregivers must demonstrate “...good cause that therapy is appropriate prior to (a court) ordering such therapy.” Therapy that terminates a child’s access to “a safe parent who is was not physically or sexually abusive and with whom the child responded or to a home the child is attached” will not be permitted, without the consent of both parties.

The recurring issue of children refusing to participate in therapy designed to reunite children with an estranged parent, sometimes referred to as “reunification therapy” is also addressed by the new amendments. “No treatment program intended to reunite a child with a party from whom that child is estranged and to whom the child resists or refuses contact shall be ordered by the court without the consent of both parties, and upon a determination that the child is of sufficient

Each year, the LRS makes approximately 2,000 referrals for callers with legal problems who are able to afford a private attorney; many of them fee generating cases. You can be a part of this important program that helps expand your client base through pre-screened referrals while providing a terrific community service for individuals requiring legal services.

The annual registration fee is just \$100 for those admitted to the New Jersey Bar for up to five years, or \$200 for those admitted six years or more. Please note that all LRS panel members are required to remit back to the Association 10% of fees collected in excess of \$500 for all matters referred by the LRS. The fee applies to any referral received from the LRS and is payable when the participating attorney receives payment for services rendered.

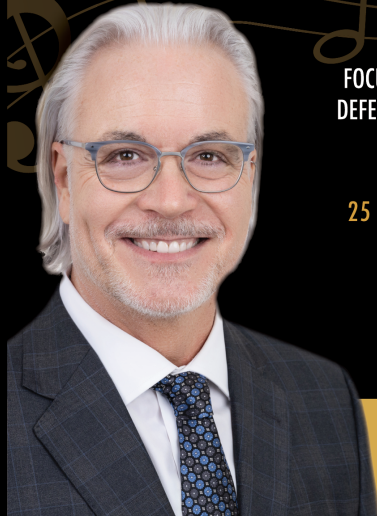
A completed application, together with the appropriate enrollment fee and required original certificate of malpractice insurance coverage, must be returned to the Bar Association before any referrals can be made.

fans, Chardonnay. From the Skurnik portfolio there is **2023 Jax Napa Valley Y3 Chardonnay**. In a wine region that has no shortage of top scoring, high end Chardonnays, this is a more modestly made and priced option to consider. It has a clean, soft, and unassuming approach that relies on its stone and melon fruit rather than oak accents or a creamy texture. There are touches of talc and a subtle minerality that add an additional dimension. Finally, let me venture outside the Skurnik portfolio to mention a wine I have enjoyed many times that sells for a price that somewhat belies its pedigree. **2023 Vina Los Vascos Chardonnay** is from the Chilean winery founded in 1988 by the owners of Bordeaux's famous Chateau Lafite Rothschild. It displays lime fruit that is unadorned by any oak or lees impressions leaving it crisp but not lean, and vibrant without any shrillness or angularity. This vintage and 2024 are of equal quality and both have been available at a nicely discounted price.

age.” It will accordingly now be more difficult for parents or guardians in New Jersey to compel reunification therapy and/or any other type of therapy, when a child is of sufficient age and refuses to participate in same, unless the non-estranged parent/legal guardian consents to same.

As a practitioner, it will be interesting to see how our New Jersey courts will interpret this new statutory language and, hopefully, support the paramount interests of keeping our children safe and, in addition, empowering our children to make choices for themselves as they grow older. While the new amendments may limit a reviewing court's ability to implement therapies to address, improve and/or repair the relationships between New Jersey parents/guardians and their children and/or otherwise order custody arrangements that are contrary to a child's expressed preferences, hopefully, our children, when of sufficient age, will know what's best for themselves and, if necessary, express said preferences in the context of therapy with “state licensed mental health professional” before, rather than after, there is a custody dispute.

Finally, what the new custody statute did not restrict was access to mediation by all parties to resolve whatever custody and parenting time disputes they may have, in the context of a divorce and/or separation. With mediation, parents get to decide what's important and how best to address the safety and preferences of their children. In this regard, it is worth noting that the new amendments did not change the statutory provision that makes it clear that no parent/guardian should “...be deemed unfit unless that parents conduct has a substantial adverse effect on the child.” Hopefully, this provision still applies to most of the parents and children addressing custody matters and, as such, parents/guardians will reach agreement rather than need the assistance of therapists and/or the courts.

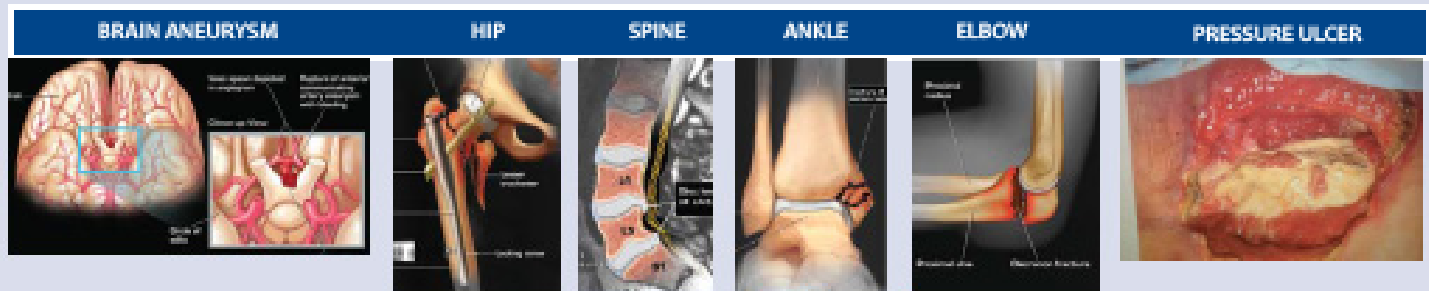

LRS Practice Categories

Referrals rotate within each of the special area panels independently of the others. For example, if a panelist requests referrals in all of the 5 primary categories and in 5 special categories, he/she will rotate within 10 panels simultaneously. This attorney could possibly receive referrals from each panel independent of the others according to the rotation. Once a referral is made in any one of the subcategories of a primary panel, the attorney will automatically be moved to the bottom of the rotation for that category.

Remember that you should only indicate areas in which your practice, experience and education permit you to represent clients competently as required by the Code of Professional Responsibility.
